Dr. Ruby Dey received her BA from the University of Maryland, College Park, her Master of Public Health from George Washington University, and completed her medical training at Howard University School of Medicine. She conducted her pediatric residency at the Children's Hospital of Sinai and has since then been a practicing pediatrician at the Mid-Atlantic Permanent Medical Group (MAPMG) for 15 years. Dr. Dey has served in various leadership roles, including as a mentor to the next generation of pediatricians and pediatric leaders, Assistant Chief of Pediatrics, and currently as the Chief of Pediatrics in Baltimore. In her role, Dr. Dey oversees the pediatric care provided to Kaiser patients at 7 medical centers and 3 hospitals.

Dr. Dey's tireless dedication to her patients and their families has earned her recognition for multiple years in Baltimore Magazine Top Doctors, Kaiser Quality and Kaiser Member Patient Satisfaction awards.
