Early Literacy Benefits

- Maximizes critical period of rapid brain development during the first 5 years of life long before other school-based interventions
- · Families are 2.5X more likely to read together
- · Accelerates language development by 3-6 months
- Increases receptive and expressive language ability
- · Contributes to academic success


Early Relational Health Benefits

- Helps build safe, stable, and nurturing relationships
- · Facilitates positive interaction and attention from caring adults
- · Increases stimulation from people and environment
- · Improves social and emotional development

Healthcare Benefits

- · Increases well-child visit attendance
- Addresses social drivers of health and supports health equity
- Improves healthcare quality
- Enhances developmental surveillance
- · Improves relationships between patients and providers
- Increases clinic morale and provider satisfaction
