


Baby Dream/Me Nyuam Npau Suav


How everyday play and bedtime stories grow love, connections, and brainpower.

Spend the day with a busy baby and her two dads, and learn the words for things you do and see along the way!


This innovative first-words book features labels for objects, actions and sound effects, as well as a fun seek-and-find element.




Rosa Loves Dinasaurs/A Rosa le encantan los dinosaurios




All Are Welcome

All Are Welcome lets young children know that no matter what, they have a place, they have a space, they are welcome in their school.




Dumpling Day


Hair Love


In a sweetly appealing tale of overcoming your fears, Gaia Cornwall captures a moment between a patient and encouraging father and a determined little boy you can't help but root for.

The team behind the Newbery Medal winner and Caldecott Honor book Last Stop on Market Street and the award-winning New York Times bestseller Carmela Full of Wishes once again delivers a poignant and timely picture book that's sure to become an instant classic.

Milo is on a long subway ride with his older sister. To pass the time, he studies the faces around him and makes pictures of their lives. There's the whiskered man with the crossword puzzle; Milo imagines him playing solitaire in a cluttered apartment full of pets. There's the wedding-dressed woman with a little dog peeking out of her handbag; Milo imagines her in a grand cathedral ceremony. And then there's the boy in the suit with the bright white sneakers; Milo imagines him arriving home to a castle with a drawbridge and a butler. But when the boy in the suit gets off on the same stop as Milo--walking the same path, going to the exact same place--Milo realizes that you can't really know anyone just by looking at them.
