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PROGRAM MODEL

- Providers gift families a new book at each well-child checkup that is developmentally and culturally appropriate
- Talk with families about the importance of reading aloud, reflecting on their child's developmental progress, and telling them what to expect next
- Show families how to look at books and talk about the stories with their children and offer individualized advice for languagerich engagement
- Encourage families to cuddle up and read together at home and build routines around books

EVIDENCE-BASED OUTCOMES FOR FAMILIES THAT READ TOGETHER

Over 20 independent, peer-reviewed studies support Reach Out and Read's impact.

Improved Early Language and Literacy-

- Maximizes critical period of rapid brain development during the first 5 years of life long before other school-based interventions
- Families are 2.5X more likely to read together
- Accelerates language development by 3-6 months
- Increases receptive and expressive language ability
- Contributes to academic success

Supports Early Relational Health

- Helps build safe, stable, and nurturing relationships
- Facilitates positive interaction and attention from caring adults
- Increases stimulation from people and environment
- Improves social and emotional development

Better Healthcare -

- Increases well-child visit attendance
- Addresses social drivers of health and supports health equity
- Improves healthcare quality
- Enhances developmental surveillance
- Improves relationships between patients and providers
- Increases clinic morale and provider satisfaction

NEW STUDY SHOWS TRANSFORMATIVE IMPACT OF REACH OUT AND READ

A new, peer-reviewed study <u>"The Effect of Exposure to Reach Out and Read on Shared Reading Behaviors"</u> in *Academic Pediatrics* demonstrates the impact of Reach Out and Read. The research includes more than 100,000 survey responses collected from families between 2014-2019.







MIRRORS & WINDOWS INITIATIVE

We received a \$45,000 grant from Reach Out and Read — funded by a portion of a record-setting gift from philanthropist MacKenzie Scott — to create a diverse book initiative. The project, Mirror & Windows, helped us to deepen the dialogue with clinic staff about the importance of diverse books that both reflect children's lives and offer windows into the experience of other people. The funds have provided diverse book packs to clinics and has allowed clinics to apply for a scholarship that will provide additional book funding. We had 45 scholarship submissions for our Mirrors & Windows Scholarship and were inspired by each clinics' commitment to increasing their diverse books for their patients and families.

WISCONSIN CLINICS TO RECEIVE THOUSANDS OF INCLUSIVE CHILDREN'S BOOKS

FOR REACH OUT AND READ'S 35TH ANNIVERSARY



A collaboration between Reach Out and Read and Scholastic

Reach Out and Read Wisconsin is among the first in the country to receive the new children's book collection, 35 for 35! Reach Out and Read partnered with Scholastic to curate and print the 35-book collection in honor of the nonprofit's 35th anniversary.

Reach Out and Read Wisconsin will distribute **4,235 books** from the new collection to clinics across the state.

"This collection aligns with our Mirrors and Windows initiative, ensuring children who receive Reach Out and Read books will see their own cultures reflected or learn about kids who might be different," said Reach Out and Read Wisconsin Executive Director DeDe Williams. "It's vital that our books represent all Wisconsin families, and this collection gives us another way to do just that."

According to research done by the University of Wisconsin's Cooperative Children's Book Center, less than 15% of children's books over the past two decades have contained multicultural characters or story lines. When a child sees a character that looks like them in a book, it allows them to see themself in that character. It helps the child see that their stories matter, it helps them to believe that they matter. Furthermore, if that character is doing something extraordinary or fantastic, it helps the child to believe or imagine, that they too can do fantastic and extraordinary things. Reading encourages children to dream beyond what they may see in their everyday life and environment. Everyone has a different life. Everyone has a story. Reading stories about people from other cultures helps us learn about people that we may not see in our neighborhoods or in our day-to-day life. By increasing exposure to various cultures and ideas, children (and adults) can further develop empathy towards others."
